### **Key Insights**


In the fourth guarter of 2021:

- Q4 Rebound in Exports: Washington state exported roughly \$18 billion in goods a 59% increase over the prior guarter and a 39% increase over Q4 of 2020.
- Imports Remain Steady: State imports increased 3% over the prior guarter and 19% over Q4 of 2020 with \$17 billion in goods coming into Washington state.
- Big Volumes in WA Ports: Washington ports transported roughly \$47 billion in goods 9% more than in the prior guarter and 19% increase over Q4 of 2020.




#### WA Jobs Supported by Exports of Goods and Services 1,000s of jobs; As of 2020
